

King's Youth Team Volunteer Role and Responsibilities

At The King's Church, Wisbech our vision is: 'That we may present everyone mature in Christ' – by Loving Jesus, Building Relationships and Serving our Community.

By volunteering to be part of the King's Youth team you are playing a part in making this a reality in your life as well as in the lives of others. The King's Youth team exists to provide a safe and exciting place where secondary school aged children can receive Bible teaching more appropriate to their age and interests. So, as well as a Bible message and songs, also expect fun, food, active games and social time.

The safety of everyone under our care is of utmost importance. As volunteers will be working with children, we will be undertaking DBS checks for those involved in the King's Youth team. If you already have a DBS check that is less than 3 years old and it is the same level as the one we require, you don't need to get another one done, but will need to show it to us and we will take a copy for our records.

There will be a minimum of 2 adult volunteers present at each King's Youth session. One will be the leader while the other will play a supporting role.

Planning for each session will be done for you and will be given to you ahead of time.

Serving as a volunteer not only helps others, but it also helps you and your discipleship. 'Serving our Community' is one of the three core pillars of our vision and all three should be in place in your life in order for you to grow in maturity in Christ. So thank you for taking this step and we pray it will be a real benefit to your spiritual growth too. Your help is greatly appreciated.

Volunteer Role Title: King's Youth Team Member

Preparation time required for this role: Training (1hour) + Safeguarding and Health & Safety training.

Frequency: once a month (during Sunday morning church)

DBS Check: This role requires an Enhanced DBS Check with access to the Barred List

General Role Description:

- Arrive at The Queen Mary Centre on Saturday at 9:45am to help set up after prayer meeting
- Arrive on time
- Move tables and chairs as required

- Receive training at various stages (eg. Safeguarding / Being a King's Kid's Volunteer etc).
- Work together with other volunteers on the team
- Keep children in your care safe
- Get involved with the activities at King's Youth – its better to lead by example
- Read emails that inform you of the King's Youth sessions, rota updates etc.
- Pack away equipment (if any)
- Inform Key Leader of availability for rota and as soon as possible if unable to attend on your scheduled slot
- In the case of a fire alarm during King's Youth - you should calmly lead those under your care out through the nearest fire exit and around the outside of the building to the Fire Assembly point. Check whether all those in the group are at the Fire Assembly Point.
- Read and implement the church's Safeguarding of Vulnerable People Policy and Procedures
- Read and agree to a Code of Conduct
- Read the King's Youth Risk Assessment

(If there is a behaviour issue, the parents of that child will be informed and asked to come and deal with the situation themselves. We will have received written permission from parents and guardians for the young person to attend the group, so can phone them if required).
